

A Holy Year of Mercy

In September, eighth grade students David Anderson and Barbara Mann traveled to the Blanchette Catholic Center in Joliet, along with religion teacher, Mrs. Claire Adachi, to participate in the Catholic Schools Office of the Diocese of Joliet's devotional project entitled *Immersed in Saving Grace*. This diocesan-wide project celebrates Pope Francis' announcement of the extraordinary jubilee, *A Holy Year of Mercy*, aimed to highlight the Catholic Church's "mission to be a witness of mercy." The jubilee will begin on December 8, the feast of the Immaculate Conception.

In combination with the *Immersed in Saving Grace* and *A Holy Year of Mercy*, each school family (grades 1-8) has or will have an opportunity to pray at home with their family members. The Prayer Bag, containing a *Guide to Praying as a Family*, offers different devotions and prayers for families, and is shared with each family for a week. Through this devotional project, we hope to lead our students and families into a deeper prayer life.

Asbestos Management Plan

Please be advised that the Asbestos Management Plan for St. Walter School required by 40 CFR 763.93 and the Illinois Asbestos Abatement Act is available for inspection during normal business hours by representatives of the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency and the State of Illinois, the public, including teachers, other school personnel, and their representatives, and parents at the following location: 201 W. Maple Avenue, Roselle, IL 60172.

During 2015, St. Walter School underwent the required asbestos re-inspection process. The results of that are included in a document available from the school office. If our school conducted an asbestos removal project, that information is also contained in the asbestos management plan.

If you would like a copy of the asbestos management plan or other asbestos management documentation, please contact the school office at 201 W. Maple Avenue, Roselle, IL 60172. We will provide a copy within 5 working days after receipt of a written request for inspection. The school may charge the reasonable cost of making any copies requested.

After Hours Building Access

We ask our families and students to please not return to the building on Tuesdays after 3:30 pm. Religious Education classes are in session, and students may not interrupt these classes for forgotten books or materials.

We also ask that students and parents not enter the school building after our main office has been closed. This includes the late afternoon, on weekends and before and after Masses on Saturday and Sunday.

All staff, maintenance personnel and parish volunteers have been instructed to deny access to the school building when regular staff is not present. Thank you for your cooperation.
